Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

*This is the third of five Sundays focused on Jesus as the bread of life.*

**The Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**

**~ August 15 . . .** This is a time that we commemorate Mary's death, burial and resurrection . . . her sharing in Christ's victory over death, as she makes her entrance into God's kingdom. In the assumption we visualize Mary's glory as she is taken up to heaven, body and soul. Mary, the Mother of God, was the model disciple. Jesus declared her blessed for unquestionably doing the will of God. Mary is our model of faith and we, too, can look forward to being in heaven with God and all those who say "yes" to Jesus and follow him. Through Mary we have been given great hope that we will share in her heavenly glory. Pray Mary's own prayer of joy, (Luke 1:46-55).



*The Magnificat*

*"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord;  
my spirit rejoices in God my Savior.*

*For He has looked upon his handmaid's lowliness.  
Behold, from now on will all ages call me blessed.  
The Mighty One has done great things for me,  
and holy is His name.*

*His mercy is from age to age to those who fear him.  
He has shown might with his arm,  
dispersed the arrogant of mind and heart.

**Feast Days of the Week:**

**St. Lawrence (+258) - August 10 . . .** Lawrence was one of



the most significant martyrs of the early church. He is the topic of countless works of art and the patron of more churches in Rome than any other saint except Mary. He is remembered for his extraordinary charity to the poor and hungry. Lawrence gave himself totally to God even to the end when he was roasted to death on a grill, shortly after the martyrdom of the pope he served.

**St. Clare of Assisi (+1253) - August 11 . . .** Clare was a close friend of and greatly inspired by St. Francis of Assisi. Clare followed the example of Francis and founded a religious community of the Poor Clares who

dedicated themselves to a life of prayer, simplicity and poverty. Barefoot, simple and devout, she led the group of sisters at San Damiano.

**St. Maximilian Mary Kolbe (+1941) - August 14 . . .**

Maximilian Kolbe was a Franciscan Monk who was imprisoned at Auschwitz during World War II. He gave his life so that a father of children could live. He was the founder of the Militia of Mary Immaculate.
