
October 31, 2021 ~ Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time



“Come fill our hearts with a spirit of love!”

Today’s readings point to what is most essential to living out our discipleship in Christ: love. During the last days before his death and resurrection, Jesus spent his time preaching and teaching in the temple in Jerusalem. In today’s gospel a scribe asks Jesus, *“which is the first of all the commandments?”* Jesus responds with the ancient Jewish proclamation of faith in the one God, and devotion to loving God with *“all your heart, soul, mind and strength.”* While this is the first commandment, Jesus follows it immediately with a second: *“You shall love your neighbor as yourself.”* Within these two phrases, we find the beating heart of what it means to live life in Christ. In his response, Jesus tells us that love of God and love of neighbor comprise the essence of morality, explaining, *“there is no other commandment greater than these.”* Although our Christian faith can at times lead to complex conversations about ethics and the discernment of proper action, Jesus gives us a litmus test that all our decisions must pass in order to be considered godly: they must have love at their heart. In our journey of faith, we are constantly called to grow in our love of God and others. Rather than a sentimental or fleeting fancy, the love we are called to demands everything from us: our time, energy, and strength of will. When our words and deeds are motivated by love of God and neighbor, we are truly living as members of the kingdom of God. As we continue the path of discipleship, let us be attentive to the quality of our love of God and others and always be devoted to living more deeply the self-giving love Jesus modeled on the cross.

This weekend we remember our loved ones from the parish who have embraced eternal life in the last year and we pray for their families and friends who continue to mourn their loss. Marked with the sign of faith, we recall their humor and work, affection and trust, enthusiasm and celebration for life. We are also reminded of what we have lost and what we hope to gain. Our prayer this weekend is for comfort, healing, and peace to be upon all those who grieve. Intentions from our All Souls Day envelopes will be remembered throughout the month of November.

Of the 17,007 parishes in the United States 3,363 (19%) are without a resident pastor and today there are 9,119 fewer priests in the United States since 2000. Currently 15 men are preparing for the priesthood (over a span of 8 years of study) from our diocese. Please continue to pray for vocations to all aspects of ministry. Anyone who is interested in pursuing a vocation to ministry in the priesthood, religious life, or permanent diaconate is encouraged to contact the Vocation Office of the Diocese.
