“Bring your light to all the world!”

As we wind down this liturgical year and point ourselves to the Advent season, we find Jesus once again inviting the disciples today to see not as human beings do, but as God does. Whereas humans often lavish attention on those who are able to donate large sums from their wealth and abundance, Jesus lifts up the model of the poor widow whose donation to the temple might only amount to a few cents but symbolizes a giving of all she has. Jesus tells the disciples *“this poor widow has put in more than all the other contributors.”* His words give us insight into the mind of God, where the wealthy and poor are equal, and the generosity of one is not greater than that of another. It also sharpens our eyes to recognize the many small and humble actions that happen around us each and every day. St. Teresa of Calcutta famously stated, “Not all of us can do great things...but we can do small things with great care.” It seems that to God, the small things done with great love are really the most important actions. Each day we are given

the opportunity to generously give of ourselves as the widow does in today’s gospel: to sit with an aging parent or care for small children, to take care of the poor or to simply offer a kind word to someone having a difficult day. All of these seemingly insignificant expressions are what creates the kingdom of God in the here and now. If our intent is to follow Christ, we must keep our hearts centered on humble service and profound generosity as we strive to live lives of discipleship and service. As we enter this time of harvest and thanksgiving may we always have generous thoughts and sincere hearts in service to God and one another.

VOCATION AWARENESS WEEK

National Vocation Awareness Week is this week. This celebration encourages us to recognize and promote vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The need to encourage, pray and foster vocations to ministry continues to be of utmost importance. Of the 17,007 parishes in the United States 3,363 (19%) are without a resident pastor and today there are 9,119 fewer priests in the United States since 2000. Currently 15 men are preparing for the priesthood (over a span of 8 years of study) from our diocese. Please continue to pray for vocations to all aspects of ministry. Anyone who is interested in pursuing a vocation to ministry in the priesthood, religious life, or permanent diaconate is encouraged to contact the Vocation Office of the Diocese.
