August 28, 2022 ~ Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time



"We believe in the love of our God!"

Today's gospel reading opens with a well-known parable about the last being first. The entirety of the Christian message can be summarized by Jesus's words: *Everyone who exalts themselves will be humbled, but the one who humbles themselves will be exalted.*" This is the message of the cross *par excellence*. Christ gives us a model of how we must lower ourselves so as to not cling to power or riches but to find strength in humility and lowliness. While this message takes the form of a parable, it might better be described as a wisdom saying or a foundation for one's approach to life. If our faith is a celebration of humility and lowliness, it is also a celebration of the vulnerable. There is something unsettling about vulnerability. Even the root meaning of the word suggests that it is something to avoid *-vulnus* which means "wound." Why would we want to open ourselves to being hurt? This is



where we must make an important distinction. We know all too well that there are times when vulnerability, or the capacity to be physically or emotionally open, transparent, and even wounded, has been taken advantage of. Christ's invitation to humility and vulnerability is grounded in self-knowledge. This concept is so difficult to grasp because it seems to go against everything within us. Rather than climbing up the ladder of power and prestige, wealth and success, Christ invites us to descend, to lower ourselves, to understand and welcome our own weakness and wounds. Instead of exalting ourselves, Christ invites us to follow his example and humble ourselves.

It is hard to believe that the Labor Day holiday is just around the corner. As summer begins to dwindle to just a few more weeks, be sure to take advantage of the remaining nice warm and sunny days. Be sure to get outside, take a walk, and enjoy a cool glass of lemonade this coming week!

This is opposed to our parish offertory at Holy Mass, where you unite your sacrifice with Jesus', renewing our covenant relationship with Him.




