September 18, 2022 ~ Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



*“Praise Him with the trumpet!”*

In last Sunday’s gospel we met a prodigal son; this week we meet a prodigal steward or business manager. Both squander property. Whether the steward’s wastefulness was because of negligence, incompetence, or malice we are not told. Where he is efficient, however, is in the speedy formulation of a plan that will ensure his future now that he has been denounced. He thinks quickly and shrewdly by granting debt reductions. In doing so he feathers his own reputation and assures himself of receiving another debt, one of gratitude which will result in making him welcome in the homes of those who have benefited from what he did for them. In the end, the master praises his manager, not for his business ethics, but for his flair and creativeness in a time of crisis. At the heart of the parable however is the teaching of Jesus. When Jesus says, “*you cannot serve both God and mammon,*” we typically define *mammon* as wealth or riches, which certainly makes sense in the context of this story. But *mammon* also means anything that we might rely on, including power and privilege. When Jesus tells us we cannot serve God and mammon, he essentially insists that we cannot serve both God and anything that might prevent us from fully serving



God. As we strive to do this, we must intentionally discern what is of God and what is not. We accomplish this in every day of our lives. In simple terms, feelings and desires that bring us joy and happiness or experiences of faith, hope, and love are all of God. On the contrary, when we experience fear, inadequacy, doubt or sadness, we recognize these feeling are not of God. As we grow in faith and relationship with God, we are better able to discern what is of God and what is not. Another important practice of discernment is learning how we might use our gifts to best serve God. While our lives and experiences take different forms and paths, all of us are called to respond to God’s invitation. How do we respond? Do we use our time and talents to work for justice and the betterment of others? Do we share our gifts with those who might best benefit from them? Probably none of us will ever be featured in the list of the top billionaires, but Jesus tells us that whoever can be trusted in little things can also be trusted with great things. Today, we pray that we may listen attentively to this command to serve God and in doing so be blessed with great gifts and wonders.

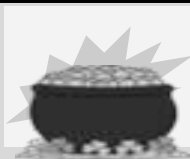

*"No servant can serve two masters. He will hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon." ~Luke 16:13*

Jesus knows that for many of us, God and money run "neck and neck" as top priority. Is money a "god" that you put before God? Giving money frees us from becoming a slave to money. It increases our dependence on God and our trust that God will provide all that we need.
