September 25, 2022 ~ Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time



*“Your faith will give you strength!”*

This week’s gospel continues with variations on a theme of poverty above riches. The story of Lazarus is a simple dichotomy: the rich man has separated himself from love and reaps the result, and the poor man receives the mercy of God upon death. The twist here is that the rich man realizes his mistake and, in an act of selflessness that’s too late, asks to warn his family, so they might not come to his fate. But God points out the obvious: *“if they will not listen to Moses and the prophet, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.”* This may seem unfair. The rich man has repented and so why not allow him to warn his brothers? But Jesus reminds us that we have received warning and road signs for life over and over through the prophets and through his own ministry. Throughout the gospels, Jesus does not necessarily condemn people who are wealthy simply for having wealth. Rather, as we have seen in the readings for the past several Sundays, Jesus denounces people who have an excess of resources that they are unwilling to share with others. Care for the people who are poor or marginalized is the essence of Jesus’s mission and ministry. The rich man had the opportunity to be in relationship with Lazarus but chose not to share his time or treasure with him. We also have the opportunity to grow in relationship with people who are hurting and lonely, sick, and hungry. How do we choose to respond? We must try to bridge the chasm in whatever way we can: through personal generosity, individual and group advocacy, information that stirs the heart to outreach, ethical business dealings and in responsible voting. We are called to respond to the word of God in this life always in our daily actions and deeds. May we continue to strive to do so with soaring spirits and awakening hearts!

This week I am happy to present our current financial report for the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2022. We continue to thrive as a parish and through your continued generosity and support we have been able to remain in a healthy financial position. We continue to meet all of our obligations and loan payments on the money raised through the weekly collections. Fish Dinner proceeds continue to be banked for future projects and our buildings and grounds remain maintained and in good shape. For a full financial report of the parish visit our parish website. This weekend I also announced our new initiative to reduce the loan for the parking lot – *The Saint William Super Cash Bonanza Raffle*. 100% of the proceeds from this raffle to go directly towards the loan for the parking lot. The raffle will be held on March 4, 2023 with a potential of over \$45,000.00 in prizes IF all 500 tickets are sold. I hope you consider, not only purchasing a ticket but also make every effort to sell as many tickets possible to help us reach our goal of 500 sold tickets. Together we continue to make Saint William Parish a great and wonder place!

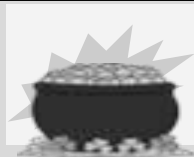

## ANNOUNCEMENT

**Western Wall**, also called Wailing Wall, is a place of prayer and pilgrimage sacred to the Jewish people. The **Western Wall** is the only remains of the retaining wall surrounding the Temple Mount, the site of the First and Second Temples of Jerusalem, held to be uniquely holy by the ancient Jewish people. It has long been a custom to push slips of paper with wishes or prayers on them into the wall's cracks.

The Western Wall is now open for all people to place their prayers.

Parishioner, Bette Lloyd will be traveling to the Holy Land and has offered to bring your prayers to the **Western Wall**. Prayers should be written on pieces of paper no larger than 4"x5". Please fold and seal the paper with tape for privacy. Prayers can be placed in the basket marked "Holy Land Prayers for the Western Wall" located in the vestibule. You are welcome to use paper that is provided near the box. Prayers will be accepted until October 9.
