October 2, 2022 ~ Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time



“Give me courage from the storms when they occur!”

As we turn the calendar page to October, today we hear the apostles ask Jesus to “*increase our faith.*” The disciples are building on the lessons we’ve heard the past few weeks. Knowing that following Jesus takes planning, intention, and lots of hard work, they ask for an increase in their faith. This isn’t just about the ability to do good, but the desire *to do* good. It is a request “to want” to follow Christ. The gospel this week gives us more insight into how fully God, in the person of Jesus, understands humanity. It is not enough to tell us to do good; Jesus leads his disciples in such a way that they realize they can pray for the desire to change their actions and grow their faith, instead of just changing their actions and being done with it. This level of personal growth gets at the heart of true Christian formation. It is deeper than following Christ in word and deed. It also requires working toward orienting one’s heart to Christ. This gospel reading comes immediately after Jesus speaks some hard words to his disciples: warnings about being a stumbling block for others on the journey of discipleship. Sometimes we characterize a person in such a state as having a “hard heart.” We tend to use this phrase colloquially to mean someone who is callous and unfeeling toward those who need help. It can also be a heart that is immovable, someone we don’t perceive as having compassion. So if we are tasked with making sure our hearts are not hardened, this means we must allow ourselves to be moved not only by the word of God but by the needs of others. It all seems a bit too much for the disciples, thus their request “*increase our faith.*” The apostles are asking Jesus for “more” faith, but Jesus responds with a qualitative image: faith is like a tiny mustard seed that God plants in our hearts. Buried deep, it germinates in darkness and if it is never tended to the seed will never break through into our lives. The lesson being that when we live by faith, even “mustard seed faith,” we can do extraordinary things! As we move into the season of harvest and thanks, let us be mindful of our faith—the quality of such faith—so that we can continue to do great things.

I would like to thank Fr. Jim Korda for his presence this weekend for Mass. I very much appreciate his kind generosity and willingness to be here this weekend as I take a few days off and attend the yearly meeting of the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions in New Orleans.

Finally, in today’s bulletin there is some more information about our “*Super Cash Bonanza Raffle*” that was announced last weekend to help reduce our Parking Lot loan debt. More tickets are available today after Mass and at the Parish Office.
