October 16, 2022 ~ Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time



“Lift up your hearts to the Lord!”

“Pray always with our becoming weary!” In today’s gospel, Jesus uses the example of someone who won’t give up, who continues to ask, over and over, for what she justly deserves until the judge relents and gives in. To do anything without ceasing is difficult. Perhaps this is why there is often an urge to dismiss Jesus’s commands as utterly impractical or unrealistic. If we are to understand Jesus’s words, we must begin to understand prayer as a lived reality, something we do every day. Only when we live our lives as a prayer – when we understand and acknowledge that everything we do connects us to God – can we begin to pray without ceasing. Prayer is less about what we do or say and more about our relationship with God. Part of growing in relationship with God is being transparent with God. We do not tell God our needs and petitions to let God know what is in our hearts. God knows us better than we know ourselves and God knows our needs better than we can possibly express. Instead, we share our needs with God so that we might grow in greater transparency with God. Part of our growing in relationship with anyone is practicing authenticity, where one can simply be one’s self around others. When we are able to live authentically and grow as the person we are called to be, we are indeed living lives of prayer. Pope

Francis reminds us that to pray without ceasing is to be keenly aware of the needs of others. Every time we work for justice, peace, and unity we articulate our prayer through our lives. When we put someone else’s needs before our own or help meet the spiritual or physical needs of someone, we grow in relationship with Christ. There is a popular phrase attributed to Pope Francis: *“you pray for the hungry and then you feed them. This is how prayer works.”* When we live in right relationship with God and others, we can heed Jesus’s command and truly pray without ceasing. Prayer that is persistent and constant must also have the qualities of trust and patience that support the belief that God answers persevering prayer. Bearing this in mind, we should not give up when it seems that our prayers aren’t being answered.

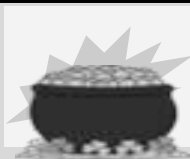

"...proclaim the word, be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient..." ~2 Timothy 4:2

PARKING LOT PROJECT – UNFORTUNATE NEWS

This week we received the disheartening news that ODOT will not grant permission for a new entrance/exit drive to the property. The proposed design had the current south entrance being eliminated and a new entrance/exit boulevard drive being relocated near our current parish sign. In order to do this ODOT needed to grant the request since they have jurisdiction over Mahoning Avenue (State Route 45.) ODOT's initial objection was with regards to left hand turns (heading north) from the new exit. ODOT stated that there was not adequate sight distance for a left turn onto Mahoning Avenue from vehicles traveling north due to the increase grade (hill) as you approach our south property line. As a result, we offered that the next exit would be a "right turn only." This proposal was also rejected by ODOT stating that the curvature of the road and utility poles looking north prevents adequate sight distance with traffic heading south. A second concern was that there would be conflicting left turns from the property across the street as well. The architect and civil engineer advised that possible recourse and alternatives to satisfy ODOT's concerns would require a traffic study (at our cost) that would delay the project indefinitely with no guarantee of a reversed decision. As a result, it was decided to keep the current south entrance as is and abandon the new entrance as part of the project. New drawings to reconfigure the parking area are being drawn. While these developments are disappointing, we hope to continue to move forward with the project. Because funding for the parking lot has already been secured based on the original design we will also continue to move forward with our "Super Cash Bonanza Raffle" as planned to address our current debt. Thank you for your patience and understanding throughout the planning of this project, which has become more involved and complicated than originally planned.
