November 13, 2022 ~ Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time



"Free from want; Free from fear, Free to live!"

As we near the end of the liturgical year and point ourselves towards the Advent season, the gospel this week begins with Jesus entering a temple and some of his disciples pointing out how lovely it is inside. Jesus uses this moment to caution everyone that what is coming isn't an easy life. He tells his listeners that destruction is coming and those who follow him will be persecuted. Understandably worried, they ask when it will happen and how they will know it's going to happen. The end times have always remained a fascination for people through generations with many pointing to different signs and scenes that could mark the end of time. The words of Jesus could easily describe our lives today. Nations continue to rise against nations, families against families, and people against people. Today's climate of scorn and being at odds with others is no different than times past. Even so, we can take comfort in Jesus's words, "by your perseverance you will secure your lives." Perseverance takes a number of Sometimes it looks like choosing to love your spouse and children every day, even when it seems impossible. Sometimes it looks like fighting injustice by condemning comments and actions of others. And, sometimes perseverance is simply taking time for prayer. In all these cases our relationship with God grounds us and gives us energy to persevere. The images contained in today's gospel are certainly apocalyptic and eschatological. They remind us of the end of time but also point us towards our heavenly home. As we come to the end of the church year and soon the end of the calendar year, Jesus urges us to maintain a clear-eyed view of the future. Jesus does not forecast the end of the world; but rather urges his followers to be confident in and obedient to God in the face of tough demands. We too are given the same message this day as we continue our discipleship of faith. By our perseverance in faith we secure our lives of eternal reward!

Our season of Advent begins in just a couple of weeks. This year our Advent theme is "God is With Us as We Journey to the Manger." Our Advent season provides us to opportunity to reflect on how our journey to the manger will be this year. We live in challenging times. Our concern about family, the economy, the future, can occupy much of our attention. In fact, we can be overcome by such thoughts especially when unexpected challenges and circumstances arise. Along with all our daily obligations we will soon be adding additional gatherings, expectations, and responsibilities. We should be grateful that the Church offers us a season of respite from all the outside distractions by providing an opportunity for reflection and renewal. May this upcoming season of Advent be a time for all of us to take a step back each week and remember what truly matters and deserves our attention. Let us not forget God is with us as we journey, not only to the manger, but as we continue our path of faith and life.
