November 6, 2022 ~ Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time



"Surly your kindness and mercy follow me!"

As Jesus inches ever closer to his passion and death, his opponents continue to argue with him. And today is no different between the Sadducees and Jesus. Their discussion is centered on the reality of the resurrection. Part of the basic beliefs of the Sadducees was that there is no such thing as resurrection. They were a Jewish sect active at the time of Jesus, but they differ from the Pharisees because they are solely focused on the physical reality of life right now. Aspects of the spiritual realm – angels, demons, the afterlife – were not entertained by the Sadducees. Today we hear them approaching Jesus to challenge him with a hypothetical question. They know it is silly but they ask it still to point out how ridiculous Jesus is. Jesus, of course, sees right through their motives and responds by



leaning into the very things the Sadducees don't accept – an afterlife that is not governed by the rules of this world. Jesus who dined with sinners and welcomed the outcast was gaining popularity among the people. Therefore, the Sadducees in today's gospel, like the Pharisees previously, want to assert, ensure, and preserve their own power among the people. Jesus concludes the argument by citing the Sadducees favorite authority, Moses, reminding them that God is a God of the living not the dead! As we move closer to our celebration of Christ the King and the end of the liturgical year, the readings continue to invite us to reflect on the sources of power in our lives. We might consider the question "from where does power come?" While God is the obvious answer, and true authority comes from God, it might be more helpful to consider the things we prioritize over God in our own lives. To whom or what do we bow? As we enter this season of harvest and thanksgiving we might consider how we assert our own power or authority over people. Are we like the Sadducees trying intentionally to confuse others, or are we genuine and honest in our actions and deeds?





National Vocation Awareness Week is this week, November 5-12, This celebration encourages us to recognize and promote vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The need to encourage, pray and foster vocations to ministry continues to be of utmost importance. Of the 17,007 parishes in the United States 3,363 (19%) are without a resident pastor and today there are 9,119 fewer priests in the United States since 2000. Currently 15 men are preparing for the priesthood (over a span of 8 years of study) from our diocese. Please continue to pray for vocations to all aspects of ministry. Anyone who is interested in pursuing a vocation to ministry in the priesthood, religious life, or permanent diaconate is encouraged to contact the Vocation Office of the Diocese.
