January 8, 2023 ~ The Epiphany of the Lord



"Endless song of thankful praise!"

Today we celebrate the Feast of Epiphany and in doing so our Christmas season in Church continues. The visitation of the Three Wise Kings to the infant child serves as a reminder to us of God's presence in our world. Through his humble birth, Jesus enters our world and lives as the manifestation and revelation of the living God. The prophet Isaiah calls upon the Israelites to rise up and shine in today's first reading. It is not an easy task for people worn and weary after years of exile. The Israelites lived in darkness for so long. Isaiah's vision of the glory to come may seem farfetched –yet, if this season of Christmas has taught us anything, it is that nothing is impossible with God. The divine light can and will transform even the darkest corners and thickest clouds. God's glory persists. It engulfs his beloved people and shines bright for all to see. Who is God calling you to be in this new year? The Epiphany story points to the many ways God calls each of us. Like the magi, we may experience a major moment of clarity when God's calling shines brightly as a star in the night sky. More likely, we will experience God's callings in the midst of our everyday lives just as the magi did, in the fields of our homes, schools and workplaces. Just as God is encountered through people, the feast of Epiphany is a prime celebration of God present and active in nature. The magi notice God's presence in the beauty and wonder of a star in the night sky. We might ask how do we encounter God in our lives? Like the magi, may we be willing to see God's presence in all people, places, and things. Our celebration today --knowing that Jesus Christ lives among us each day of our lives-- should



give us a sense of hope and fulfillment in this New Year. As we begin 2023 may we realize and remember the presence of the Lord in one another in the coming weeks and months and may our hope and courage gain in strength and our fear and insecurity vanish away. Traditionally today is also a day to bless our homes asking that God will continue to watch over and guide us in the coming year. In today's bulletin there is a special house blessing prayer for you to use to bless your home.

Finally, we extend a warm welcome to Bishop Bonnar this weekend. He visits our parish and will celebrate 11:00 a.m. Mass with us. A reception will be held after Mass in the Social Hall and all are welcome to attend.

FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING PRAYER

The Feast of Epiphany is traditionally a day to bless our homes for the upcoming year. As the Holy Family welcomed the three wise astrologers, we too, pray for blessings to come upon our homes and all who visit in the coming year. The family is asked to gather at the doorway of the home and say the following prayer:

May we who live in this home guard the sacredness of this doorway. May God protect all who enter and leave through this door.

May we welcome all to this home in the name of Christ. May the blessing of God and His peace and grace rest upon all who pass this threshold. AMEN.

After the prayer, the following mark is written above the doorway in chalk

20 + C + M + B + 23

These letters represent the three initials of the Magi's names, Casper, Melchoir and Balthazar. The numbers at the beginning and end represent the year and are separated by four crosses. The letters are also the Latin abbreviation for "Christus mansionem benedicat," which means "Christ blesses this house."
