# "Let us seek each other in our God!"

Today we enter Ordinary Time in the church year before the start of Lent in mid-February. This "inbetween" time allows us to catch our breath and is a welcomed break between the joyous festival of Christmas and the upcoming solemn season of Lent. Today's gospel reading harkens back to Advent as we hear again of John the Baptist. John make's Jesus's identity known from the very beginning. Our reading introduces a new title for Jesus –Lamb of God. It evokes an image of Jesus as a weak, wobbly animal who will one day be slaughtered in sacrifice. It certainly is not the image the people expected yet this is the way God chose to come in this world –not crowned with jewels or heading up armies– but as a little child, a sacrificial lamb who will one day give up his very life out of love for us. John the Baptist kept a watchful eye for a sign of God's presence. In a moment of awesome wonder, the great prophet saw the Spirit come down upon Jesus "like a dove from heaven." John testifies in today's gospel



about a particular experience of seeing the Spirit, and in doing so, paves the way for all disciples to pay attention to God's Spirit alive in the world. As we go about our daily lives we might consider where or in whom we encounter the Spirit of God? What presence does the Spirit embody and what can we learn? Today's reading paints a portrait of discipleship. God calls disciples to be servant leaders who shine the light of God's good news to the ends of the earth; to lives of holiness in communion with all other believers. As we continue into this new year, let us reflect on how we might become a disciple of God living out the presence of the Spirit in each of us.

Like all other places, the Church has put away the manger scene, lights, and tress for another year. The poinsettias are gone and a simple environment has returned for the next few weeks. I would like to thank all of you once again for the wonderful and joyous celebrations of Christmas over the past weeks and to all who participated, planned, and contributed to our Christmas celebrations.
