February 5, 2023 ~ Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time



"When I was happy you shared in my joy!"

This week our light imagery shifts a bit. We've been hearing for the past weeks about God being light for those who walk in darkness. Today Jesus draws on the images of salt and light to call his disciples to a life of service. Neither element exists just for itself. Salt helps people taste. Light helps people see. Jesus tells us that we, too can become light and salt for others. Our participation in God's will – in enacting justice and compassion – allows us to also participate in the beauty of God. We don't create anything new here; the light is not our own. Rather, we reflect God's light out to the world, amplifying it and making it more visible. The first reading shares the light imagery of the gospel and give us more explicit instructions for becoming light to the world. We are to provide food, shelter, and clothing for those in need. In the readings from previous weeks, this has been identified as God's work, as God's special area of interest. When we perform these deeds, we participate in God's love for those who are poor. We share in the beauty that God continuously bestows on the world. We spread God's goodness to the corners of life



it may have not yet reached. We see this image clearly at baptism when a light from the paschal candle is handed to the newly baptized. Performing works of mercy does not always look or feel This work is very often thankless, unglamorous, and good. inconvenient. The light we become is not the literal kind others can see; it takes practiced eyes of faith to see this sort of light. Yet each time we give of our resources, time, and of our very selves, the light of the Lord breaks forth like the dawn. We might consider, in these last weeks before Lent, how we are being of service to others. How are we being salt to those in need? We have been assured that good deeds, beautiful in the eyes of God, are worthy of our time. We have been charged with carrying Christ's light into the world wherever we go, thus giving us all reason to glorify God each and every day. May we fulfill this mission with soaring spirits and giving hearts.
