#### March 12, 2023 ~ Third Sunday of Lent



"Come unto me and rest."

Water emerges as a major player in today's readings. The Israelites thirst for water and Jesus encounters the Samaritan woman drawing water from a well. In both cases, water serves to meet a basic need and more. Jesus speaks of living water, the kind that satisfies thirst forever. Those who drink of it are promised eternal life. This focus on water midway through Lent draws our attention and prayers. The Lord provides us with the water we need to never thirst again. In her encounter with Jesus, the Samaritan woman begins from a place of defensiveness. She continues with Jesus in a guarded manner and moves to challenge Jesus, asking intelligent questions to probe his wisdom. When he reveals his identity as Messiah, she finally arrives at a place of trust, leaving her water jar behind and becoming a powerful evangelist. Her testimony becomes the cause of many neighbors' belief! Such is the power of an encounter with Christ; one who is known to be sinful is transformed into one whose testimony is so powerfully true that the same townspeople who would have judged her are transformed. Today's gospel is a good checkpoint as we enter this third week of our Lenten journey. It might do us good to reflect if we have used the resources God has given to us to bear fruit in the world? Have we been using the time we have to cultivate our relationship with God and others? Have we generously and selflessly shared our gifts and resources? Are we making the most of each day? It has become easy to come up with countless excuses these days resulting in a breeding ground for complacency. In some instances, our excuses have allowed us to stray from our obligations and



commitments to family, work, faith, and Mass. Today Jesus tells us, however, that we have another chance to step it up. Repentance and God's life-giving forgiveness are always possible. Our Lenten journey affords us the chance to return to God and one another in a spirit of dedication, commitment, and truth. In these remaining weeks of Lent and as we prepare for the celebration of Easter may we not squander this opportunity for new life and renewed sense of hope and promise.




# **CHAMPION PRIDE SPRING FOOD DRIVE**

The current Lenten discipline is that those age 14 and over are required to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday during the Season of Lent. However, this year Saint Patrick's Day (March 17) is this coming Friday. Taking into consideration both past practices and present circumstances, and having judged that it would serve the spiritual good of the faithful, Bishop Bonnar has granted a dispensation from the obligation of abstaining from meat this coming Friday, March 17, 2023. Note we will be serving Fish Dinners this night...so this dispensation really doesn't apply to our parish!!! Those taking advantage of the dispensation are urged to make a special additional act of Lenten sacrifice, prayer, or charity this week.
