OCTOBER 15, 2023 THE TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear friends,

As the summer days begin to wane and the days are growing shorter, we take some time to reflect about today's gospel. In today's Gospel Reading we hear of a wedding feast hosted by a king. As we'd expect, the feast reflects his personality. We're given hints of how lavish it was. Yet this earthly king symbolizes God the Father. Just as the king's earthly feast is a feast fit for a king, so the divine feast that it symbolizes is a feast befitting God: an infinite feast. In other words, the feast in the parable symbolizes Heaven itself. Jesus preaches this parable to help those listening imagine what Heaven is like.

The parable's invited guests symbolize all of mankind. Man has heard God's desire that "all peoples" and "all nations" enter into the wedding feast of Heaven. Nonetheless, they may enter only through confession of their sins. We may not be



accustomed to think of Heaven as a wedding WEEKDAYS banquet. Most of us are accustomed to think of Heaven as the fulfillment of our own greatest wishes, hopes, and desires. Nonetheless, there's one important truth that is left out of today's parable. Jesus didn't leave it out because He was a poor teacher, but because we're slow learners.

His invitation to us is to accept His death—the price of our forgiveness—as the means of union with Him. It's through this union that He invites us into the eternal wedding feast of Heaven.
